The event, fostered through collaboration with the <u>AI in Libraries Network Group of CENL</u>, will bring together representatives from various national libraries in Europe to share their experiences, strategies, achievements, and challenges in implementing artificial intelligence to manage, preserve, and make their heritage collections accessible to the public. From advanced cataloging and analysis systems to innovative methods of knowledge discovery, recreation, and library process improvements, participants will demonstrate how they have put their AI strategies into practice, transforming their collections into living and accessible assets.

With a vision that spans from strategy to concrete action, this conference will be a space for inspiration, learning, and shared engagement —a place for conversation and exchange that allows us to collectively address the highly complex and challenging issues we face today in our institutional and professional work.

The conference will take place at the headquarters of the National Library of Spain on the morning of November 22, and it will be streamed live and later accessible via the BNE YouTube channel.

In the afternoon, as part of this conference, the BNE will again host a meeting organized with the <u>CLARIAH-ES</u> consortium, a strategic pan-European research network of which the National Library of Spain is a member. This session will showcase the latest developments in the network and in digital research within our country.
